



Fargo Moorhead Community Theatre (FMCT) is committed to the health and safety of our participants and staff as it relates to COVID-19. We aspire to create a safe creative environment by implementing the following precautions:

- Participants will be asked to stay home should they feel ill. Those with a temperature of 100 or higher are advised to stay home. A thermometer will be available on site.
- Masks are to be worn as appropriate including during all rehearsals. FMCT will provide disposable masks.
- Handwashing/sanitizing will be practiced with frequency.
- Social distancing is always expected. If a distance of six feet or more cannot be maintained, a mask is required.
- Costume fittings will have special precautions in place for proper sanitation and safety. A mask will be required for all fittings.
- Rehearsals will be scheduled utilizing the minimum number of participants required.
- Gathering will be discouraged in rehearsal transitions and breaks will be taken outside as weather allows.
- Surfaces will be frequently wiped down with sanitizer. Facilities will be cleaned with increased regularity.
- Above all, FMCT pledges transparency with all information that may affect health and safety. We ask the same of our participants.

Specific to the 10-MINUTE PLAY FESTIVAL:

- Distancing will be incorporated into the blocking of our final performances.
- Masks will be a requirement during rehearsals or at times when distancing cannot be maintained in the process.
- Shows are planned to be filmed without actors wearing masks. When appropriate to the environment of the play, masks will be included as part of the final filmed production.
- The 10-Minute Play, "Virtual Online Dating" will rehearse and perform 100% virtually.

Should auditioners prefer consideration for masked and/or virtual performance opportunities only, please make note of that preference on the electronic audition form or video submission.
